



Journey of a postcard (Worksheet 4)

The journey of the postcard is all mixed up! Cut out the text and glue it under the right picture on worksheet 5 and 6:

The mail is sent to its destination. It travels in all sorts of ways – by van, truck, airplane, ship and train.

Your postcard starts its journey in the mailbox. The postcard gets collected and taken to the local post office.

From there the mail gets transported to a mail center. Each postcard gets a barcode, which can be read by machines that sort out the mail automatically. Conveyer belts transport the postcards to the right box, which contains the mail that goes to the same place.

Finally, the mailman brings the postcard to your address. You've got mail!!

At the local post office, the mail gets sorted out again, this time by hand. The mailman puts them in the different cubbyholes.
